

Haystack Rock is a 72 meter (235 foot) tall sea stack located on Cannon Beach in the state of Oregon,

N 45.884471°, W 123.968631°. The rock is home to many birds, including tufted puffins, gulls, and cormorants. It is a popular tourist destination and accessible by foot during low tide. Each year, many people become temporarily trapped on Haystack Rock when high tide engulfs the rock in water.

Haystack Rock in Cannon Beach is 235 feet tall and is accessible by foot during low tide, see

http://cannonbeachcomputers.com/tides/. Haystack Rock in Cannon beach is claimed to be the third largest monolith that can be reached by land. It is located just north of two smaller rock formations called the Needles.




Cascade Loop, *N* 47.98073°, *W* 122.193146°, 424 mi, 682 km, 8:33 hrs. Start and finish in Everett on hwy north of Seattle

Climbing from the lush rainforests of Puget Sound, U.S. Highway 2 crosses the Cascades and drops into apple orchards before reaching placid Lake Chelan. Ambitious drivers can loop back to Seattle via rugged and remote North Cascades National Park, along equally scenic Highway 20.

Where to Stop: For an unexpected treat, spend some time in kitschy Leavenworth, an old timber and railroad town that re-created itself in the 1970s as a Bavarian Alps hamlet, complete with beer gardens and lederhosen.
